Each year, in February, I highlight for you the life and ministry of an African American Lutheran. This year, I want you to meet Rev. Nelson W. Trout - the first African American Bishop in the Lutheran Church.



Rev. Dr. Nelson W.
Trout was a pioneer
in the Lutheran
Church, shattering
racial barriers and
leaving a legacy of
unwavering dedication to social justice

and vibrant preaching. Born in 1920, Trout's journey began in Columbus, Ohio, where he faced the hardships of segregation but discovered his calling to the ministry.

He graduated from Capital University and Trinity Lutheran Seminary, eventually becoming the first African American bishop in U.S. Lutheran history in 1983. Throughout his career, Rev. Trout held numerous significant positions, including:

- Associate Youth Director and Director of Urban Evangelism for the American Lutheran Church (ALC)
- Executive Director of Lutheran Social Services in Dayton, Ohi
- Professor and Director of Minority Ministry Studies at Trinity Lutheran Seminary
- Bishop of the Southwest California Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA)
- Director for Mission Theology and Evangelism Training within the ELCA's Division of Outreach

Rev. Trout's leadership transcended titles and positions. He was a powerful voice for social justice, advocating for civil rights, racial reconciliation, and inclusivity within the Lutheran Church and beyond. His fiery sermons resonated with audiences, urging them to embrace God's message of love and liberation, "I thought as I walked through the streets of Detroit, Newark, and New York City that surely the time must come when we would rise to the height of those ideals which brought this nation into being. You cannot look at the poverty of the urban poor and not remember that the God who gave us life also gave us liberty. To be consigned to the ghetto with hardly a chance to reprieve is a violation of [human] nature." (Lutheran Quarterly, May 1968)

Rev. Trout's impact on the Lutheran Church is undeniable. He broke down racial barriers, championed social justice, and inspired countless individuals through his vibrant preaching and dedication to education. His life serves as a testament to the power of faith and leadership in creating a more equitable and loving world.




