Holy Saturday is the day between Good Friday and Easter Sunday. It is a day of waiting and anticipation, as we hold vigil anticipating Jesus' resurrection. Holy Saturday is that uncomfortable time between tragedy and renewal - between death and resurrection.

In the Gospel of Matthew, we read that Jesus' disciples were gathered together on Holy Saturday, mourning the death of their rabbii, teacher, and friend. They were afraid and confused, and they did not know what to do. I often wonder what it must have been like in that upper room - waiting - trying to make sense of all that had happened.

Sometimes, our calling as people of faith, is simply to be patient and the Holy Spirit work. God may very well be working on things that we have no knowledge of. One of the signs of a mature faith is being able to wait on God's answer to prayer, even when it takes longer than we want. I've come to call that posture holy patience.

Holy patience is the ability to endure difficult times without becoming angry or frustrated. It is the ability to wait for God's timing, even when we don't understand God's plans. Holy patience is a fruit of the Holy Spirit, and it is a gift that we can ask God to give us.

Holy patience can be a true gift as we move through this world. Sometimes, it seems like God is taking a long time to answer our prayers, and we can start to get impatient. But it is important to remember that God is always working, even when we don't see it. Holy Saturday reminds us that God is always doing two things at once: sitting with us in the pain of death, and opening the door to new life.

If patience is an area where you struggle, consider making a point of setting aside some prayer time to ask God to help you grow in this way. You'll certainly have company in that prayer, not just from me, but from great saints of the past. Holy patience is not always easy, but it is worth it. When we are patient, we are able to trust God's timing and God's plans. We are able to experience God's peace and God's joy, even in the midst of difficult times.

Here are some practical tips for cultivating holy patience:

- **Pray for it.** As mentioned above, holy patience is a gift from God. Ask God to give you the patience you need to persevere through difficult times.
- **Meditate on God's promises.** When you're feeling impatient, take some time to reflect on God's promises to you. God has promised to never leave you or forsake you, and scripture tells us that God works all things together for good for those who love God.
- **Focus on the present moment.** When you're feeling impatient, it's easy to get caught up in worrying about the future or dwelling on the past. Instead, try to focus on the present moment. What can you do right now to make the situation better?
- **Be grateful for what you have.** When you're feeling impatient, it's also easy to focus on what you don't have. Instead, try to be grateful for what you do have. This will help you to shift your perspective and appreciate the good things in your life.
- **Take a break.** If you're feeling overwhelmed or impatient, sometimes the best thing you can do is take a break. Go for a walk, listen to some music, or have a conversation with a trusted friend.

Holy patience is a journey, not a destination. It's something that we will all continue to grow in as we mature in our faith. But it's a journey that is worth taking, because it will help us to experience the peace and joy that God has for us, even in the midst of difficult times.

Job Title: Youth and Family Ministry Coordinator

**Position Status:** Hourly, part-time employee (averaging 10 hours/week).

**Reporting Relationship:** The Youth and Family Ministry Coordinator works alongside the Pastor, Church Secretary, and Baptismal Ministry and Youth Committees, but is ultimately accountable to the Church Council.

**Job Summary:** The Youth and Family Ministry Coordinator will be responsible for planning and executing faithforming and community-building events for members and friends of Christ Lutheran.

**Salary:** \$20/hour to be paid bi-weekly.

Benefits: No health, life, or retirement benefits are provided with this position.

**Flexibility:** This position comes with a large amount of flexibility around when the work is done but will require periodic availability on evenings and weekends.

#### **Essential Responsibilities:**

- Work with Baptismal Ministry Committee to plan three events per year that bring together children from birth through kindergarten.
- Work with Youth Committee to plan and execute monthly events for grades K to 5.
- Work with Youth Committee to plan and execute monthly events for grades 6 to 12.
- Work with Youth Committee to plan and execute a Vacation Bible School for 3-year-olds through 5th grade.
- Work with Youth Committee to organize participation in an annual camp experience at Living Waters.
- Develop relationships with the children and youth of the congregation.
- Attend worship at Christ Lutheran at least once a month.
- Report monthly to the church council about the progress of ministries overseen.

#### **Qualifications:**

- A passion for youth and children and their faith development.
- Strong interpersonal skills and ability to handle conflict.
- Recent experience with youth and children in personal or professional settings.
- Successful candidates will pass a background check.
