As we approach the new year, many of us reflect on the past year and think about ways we can improve ourselves in the year to come. We make resolutions to exercise more, eat healthier, spend more time with loved ones, and so on. While these goals can be beneficial and help us lead happier, healthier lives, it's important to remember that we are not saved by our own efforts or good works. We are saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ. Our resolutions may help us grow as people, but they are not going to make God love you more than God already does.

Ephesians 2:8-9 says, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast." This verse reminds us that our salvation is not based on anything we do, but rather it is a gift from God that we receive through faith in Jesus.

As you make your resolutions for the new year, ask yourself, "Does this resolution help me grow into the person that God is calling me to be?" and "Does this resolution cultivate in me the fruit of the Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control)?" (Galatians 5:22-23)

1 Corinthians 15:10 says, "But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me." This verse reminds us that it is through the grace of God that we are able to accomplish anything, and that his grace is sufficient for us.

It's also important to remember that we are all imperfect and prone to failure. Even with the best intentions, we may not always follow

through on our resolutions. But this doesn't mean that we should give up on trying to improve ourselves. Instead, we can rely on the grace of God to help us grow and change.

Finally, do not allow the perfect to be the enemy of the good. Don't allow a minor setback to derail your plans. One or two missed days of a new habit - or of falling back into an old one - does not mean that you need to give up. Instead, simply remind yourself of your goal and begin again.

May the new year be a time of growth and transformation for you, as you rely on the grace of God to guide you on your journey.


Join us after worship on January 29th for brunch as we celebrate Kristen's ministry and offer our blessings on her new endeavors.
