Newsletter: secretaryonelm@sbcglobal.net During Louisville Men's Basketball's Elite Eight win over Duke ten years ago, Kevin Ware experienced what many described as the most gruesome injury ever broadcast on live television. If you happened to see an uncensored replay of the injury, that image will likely stay with you for quite a while. It was a compound fracture of his tibia, which means that the broken bone was sticking out through the skin. The reactions of the people around Ware were especially telling. Some of his teammates immediately dropped to their knees, overcome by what they had seen. Coaches, players, referees, and even fans instinctively put distance between themselves and Ware. Only one person, Luke Hancock, actually went toward his fallen teammate.



News accounts from the day report that Hancock came to Kevin Ware's side and gripped his hand. He said a prayer for and with his injured teammate, guided him through the initial trauma, and stayed with him while the medical staff stabilized him and prepared to transport him to the local hospital. To this day Hancock says that he does not know what made him go towards Ware. The best he was able to muster was, "I just didn't want him to be alone out there."

It is our natural inclination to turn away from illness or injuries. We don't tend to enjoy reminders of our own mortality. The same thing applies to addictions, mental illness, and a host of other ailments. Yet, when someone is willing to come alongside those injured in body, heart, or spirit, we see God working through human hands. Though Luke Hancock is in no way Jesus Christ, the direction of his movement on that day was certainly Christ-like. Here's how St. Paul put it in Romans 5:6-8:

> You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners Christ died for us.

God doesn't wait for us to heal ourselves before we are welcome in God's presence. Instead, God comes to us, even, and perhaps especially, when others turn away. God draws us close, binds up those places where we are broken, and then sends us out into the world, to bind up the wounds of others.


