He wore a bright reflective vest, company hoodie, faded denim jeans, and work boots that seemed like they came straight from central casting. As he was wrapping up he came into my office (where the church's internet connection enters the building) and began a few final tweaks. While everything was testing he looked up and asked, "So - what's it been like leading a faith community lately?" I tried to brush him off with a couple of hollow platitudes - but for whatever reason - he seemed to be waiting for a deeper, truer answer.

"It's been hard," I said. "It seems to me that people are carrying a lot of pain, but don't have a place to put it."

"I've seen that too," he said. "I deal with a lot of people in this job from all walks of life and it seems like everyone is close to their breaking point."

Truth is, I've had versions of this conversation with other faith leaders, scoutmasters, teachers, little league umpires, and barbers. There's something in the air right now that we are having trouble naming but somehow know isn't quite right.

It shouldn't come as a surprise. We've all had several extra helpings of grief thrust upon us in the last few years. We've

lost loved ones to tragedy, old age, and COVID. We've made and canceled plans for graduation parties, visits to grandchildren, family vacations, and so much more. Each of these losses is another encounter with grief. And each new wave of grief compounds on top of the others leaving us hurting and searching for answers.

If you have found yourself having difficulty focusing as well as you used to, or getting irritable more quickly, or just not finding joy in the places where you used to find it, there's a decent chance that you have some grief to process.

During our mid-week Lenten services this year, we are going to be working on our grief together. We'll use stories from scripture to help root us in the promises of God and trust that the One who knows us better than we even know ourselves can heal the grief inside of us. This isn't going to be a time of mournfulness and dirges, but a chance to let God do what God does best - bring wholeness and healing. There's going to be space to think and pray, a chance to hear scripture, to be quiet, to sing together, and to ask God for the kind of healing that we need as individuals and as a society. I hope you'll join us on Wednesdays at 7pm.
